Medical/Acute Care Oncology

QUALIFICATIONS

- Applicants must be a current student or graduate of an accredited PA or NP Program AND must have successfully graduated from their program by 3 months prior to start date to allow time for exams, licensure and credentialing
- Must hold a baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university; a clinical or health-oriented masters degree is preferred
- PAs must have passed or be eligible to take the NCCPA Examination
- Adult, FNP, or Acute Care Nurse Practitioners must have passed or be eligible to take the AANP or ANCC certification examination
- Must obtain licensure in the state of Washington prior to the program start date
- Must be eligible for medical staff privileges and faculty appointment

OVERVIEW

The Medical/Acute Care Oncology Fellowship for Advanced Practice Providers is being offered to Physician Assistants and Nurse Practitioners through Fred Hutchinson Cancer Center and its alliance partner, the University of Washington.

Benefits include a stipend of \$90k/year, medical and dental benefits, and CME support.

The program will have a start date of: November 1, 2023
(Applications are due by April 1, 2023)

For the upcoming 2023-2024 cohort:

A total of 6 fellows will be selected for two medical oncology focuses:

- **General hematology/oncology**
- **Acute care/inpatient hematology/oncology**

APPLICATION

Your application packet should include:

- Personal statement of interest including a clear indication of why you are applying to this fellowship and which area of focus you would like to pursue.
- Curriculum Vitae
- Unofficial transcripts from PA or NP program
- 2 reference letters from clinical peer or supervisor.

**If less than 2 years of NP/PA experience, one of the letters is required from your Program Director.*

Applications are due April 1, 2023.
